Seeds were started indoors earlier this year, and the young plants are right on track to be ready for gardeners soon. The upcoming sale will include a variety of starter plants, such as:

- Italian San Marzano Roma tomatoes
- Cherry tomatoes
- Jalapeño peppers
- Cucumbers
- Dwarf sunflowers



These sturdy starter plants will be ready to go into garden soil once the frost date has passed.
